

## a note from the Chairman ...

### Welcome to the Christmas 2021 edition of our Parish Newsletter.

Life is slowly beginning to return to something more normal and we are beginning to see the slow emergence of village activities. Cricket has been played throughout the summer and the football season has already started. Clubs are back in the Elder Bank Hall, the BNS&SC has held a rounders tournament and The Humble Bumble Café is back to full capacity with Bev and her team busy organising their second Christmas Market.

The postponed Village Bash finally took place on Sunday, 19 September and what an afternoon, with a bumper number of people attending and a great amount of money raised. I'd like to thank all the volunteers for their hard work in putting the event together.

In the last Newsletter, I reported that we had held a Public Meeting with the RAF on their planning application to install a radar tower on the Tactical Medical Wing site off Carterton Road. This meeting was very well attended with over 60 people coming along to listen to the RAF's presentation and to ask their own questions and express their views. Residents living on Burford Road, Manor Road and Brize Meadow got together and prepared a very detailed document that they presented at the Planning Meeting, which was held on Monday, 11 October. Unfortunately, the decision did not go our way and planning permission was granted. However, the PC will be reviewing the Conditions associated with this permission and ensure they are complied with. We are requesting another meeting with RAF Brize Norton to discuss what mitigation measures they will be putting in place to reduce the visual impact of the tower.

In October, Bloor Homes advised the Parish Council that they would be starting to landscape the northern section of the Mary Ellis Country Park. I thought that it would be a lovely idea if the children could somehow be involved with this, and Bloor Homes agreed. Friday, 12th November saw two groups of children from the primary school come up to the park,



armed with wellies and spades, eight trees were planted by the children in the morning and ten trees planted in the afternoon by the older children. This later session began with a blessing of the area conducted by Rev Ian Howard. Our local M.P., Robert Courts, also came along to help with the planting, as well as our District Councillor Alex Postan. We all went home a lot muddier than we arrived, but I think everyone involved really enjoyed themselves. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Bloor Homes for arranging the day and to their landscaping team who pre-dug the holes and then helped the children with the planting when it got a bit hard going for them.

As you will read later in the Newsletter, the Parish Council is supportive of the 20's Plenty speed limit campaign and I hope you will take the opportunity to complete the online survey. For those who prefer, a copy of the survey will also be available in the Humble Bumble café.

I'm very pleased to let you know that we appointed a new Clerk in September, Mrs Jo Webb. Many of you may already know Jo as she held this role previously and she also helps out at the school. Welcome Jo!

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the people who keep this village looking good throughout the year. To Fred Bellenger for keeping the playing field looking so good and to him and his wife, Kath for keeping the war memorial looking beautiful. Also to Gary Jarvis, our handyman who keeps the shrubbery under control and carries out all the maintenance work that needs doing.

## • The Queen's Platinum Jubilee (2-5 June 2022)

In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, seventy years of service, having acceded to the throne on 6th February 1952 when Her Majesty was 25 years old.

Throughout the year, Her Majesty and members of the Royal Family will travel around the country to undertake a variety of engagements to mark this historic occasion culminating with the focal point of the Platinum Jubilee Weekend in June

An extended bank holiday, from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June, will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the historic milestone. The four days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflection on The Queen's 70 years

of service.

The Queen's Birthday Parade (Trooping the Colour): More than 1,400 parading soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians will come together in the traditional Parade to mark The Queen's official birthday, usually held on the second Saturday in June. Beginning at Buckingham Palace, the Parade will move down The Mall to Horse Guard's Parade, joined by members of the Royal Family on horseback.



**The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacons:** The United Kingdom's long tradition of celebrating Royal Jubilees, Weddings and Coronations with the lighting of beacons will be continued to mark the Platinum Jubilee. Beacons will be lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories.

For the first time, beacons will also be lit in each of the capital cities of the Commonwealth countries to celebrate The Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We have signed up to take part in this



and Tony Shillingford has kindly volunteered to do this again.

#### Friday 3rd June

**Service of Thanksgiving:** A Service of Thanksgiving for The Queen's reign will be held at St Paul's Cathedral.

#### Saturday 4th June

**The Derby at Epsom Downs:** Her Majesty The Queen, accompanied by Members of the Royal Family, will attend the Derby at Epsom Downs.



**Platinum Party at the Palace:** The BBC will stage and broadcast a special live concert from Buckingham Palace that will bring together some of the world's biggest entertainment stars to celebrate the most significant and joyous moments from The Queen's seven decade reign.

#### Sunday 5th June



The Jubilee Big Lunch: Every year since the idea began in 2009 The Big Lunch has encouraged communities to celebrate their connections and get to know each other a little bit better, coming

together in a spirit of fun and friendship. In 2022 The Big Lunch will bring the Jubilee celebrations into the heart of every community.

People are invited to share friendship, food and fun with neighbours as part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. A Big Jubilee Lunch can be big or small - street party or picnic, tea and cake or a garden barbeque.

#### The Platinum Jubilee Pageant: A pageant



featuring over 5,000 people from across the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth will take place against the backdrop of Buckingham Palace and the surrounding streets. It will combine street arts, theatre, music, circus, carnival and costume and celebrate the service of Her Majesty's reign, as well as honouring the collective service of people and communities across the country.

use, enough for everyone in a class to have one each. This has already enabled us to teach word processing and typing, and I am looking forward

to using them for computer programming later on in the year.

The Falcons and Voyagers classes held our



annual Armistice Day commemoration on 11th November. We started by reading reflections in the church before moving to the war memorial for the two

minutes' silence. Thank you very much to Mrs Bostock (and Mr Bostock too) for decorating the war memorial so well with the children's work.

#### **Christmas Productions**

We are going ahead and preparing to do

our Christmas productions as planned. The plan includes a smaller, socially-distanced audience and asking all audience members to wear masks unless they are exempt.

However, if we are unable to hold live performances because of covid, we will livestream it rather than canceling so the children still have the fun of performing.

The Reserves sit in 4th place in Division 3 and are still to play in the Jack Busby Cup.


We thank the Managers and players who have helped keep things moving and hopefully in the next newsletter we will have a much more positive report.

#### Mary Ellis Country Park


Bloor Homes is in the process of landscaping the new Country Park with new native tree and shrub planting, with large areas to be sown as wildflower meadow. Nearly 400 trees are to be planted across the Development as a whole, the majority of which will be located in the Country Park. Species will include Beech, Silver Birch, Field Maple, Hornbeam, Rowan, Hazel, Cherry and Poplar.

# **20mph speed limit** for Brize Norton?

Oxfordshire County Council is changing its approach and acceptance of 20mph restrictions which will enable a much greater coverage across Oxfordshire.

Their proposal is aimed to:

- make streets safer
- encourage residents to walk or cycle
- reduce noise and pollution

This initiative will not be compulsory and will therefore need to be supported by the Parish Council and the local County Councillor.

Measures supported will be from a simple change of speed signs to more complex solutions in areas that can range from a whole village or a single street. Speed cameras and road humps will not be used.

The introduction of 20mph restrictions in other areas has already cut speeds and accidents.

A proposal for this new approach was approved by OCC on **Tuesday 19 October.** 

Your OCC County Councilor, Nicholas Field-Johnson, and Brize Norton Parish Council is supportive of the '20's Plenty' campaign to introduce a 20mph speed limit in various builtup areas of our village. However, to enable us to pursue this scheme, **we initially need your feedback as to whether you support it or not.**
