"Stop the drips at St Brits"

Dear Friend(s)

Now you can see the scaffolding towering over the roof, can you believe that we **did** it?!! We have raised sufficient money and been successful in applying for grants to make restoring the church roof a reality. The fund raising team and the people behind the grant applications have done a truly magnifent job and their reward is to see the scaffolding in place in just under three years. We thank all Friends of St Britius for their tremendous support during this period.



The same contractor will work on both phases and Phase 2 can start immediately following Phase 1 so that we have the whole project complete before the next bat breeding season. We are also saving money by scaffolding the whole of the church in one go.

The table shows the current financial position. Although the costs of Phase 1 are firm, we are still working on estimated figures for Phase 2 and reliant on English Heritage and the Diocese giving the go ahead. We are submitting our figures to English Heritage for Phase 2 and await receipt of their contract and grant monies. We are assuming recovery of the allowable VAT through the Listed Places of Worship (LPW) scheme. The recent news that WREN has offered a grant means that we can cover all the known costs.
